God's Plans > My Plans

Dearest Family and Friends,

When I was at Colorado State University - Fort Collins (CSU) last April, I met a young man named Russ. I knew my conversation with Russ was going to be unique because, while I am generally the one to start on-campus conversations, Russ was the one to initiate this one. He thanked me for standing in front of the Justice For All (JFA) exhibit.

After a few short minutes and several questions, I learned that Russ was solidly pro-life and a deep thinker. I then asked him, **“You sound like you have a strong pro-life belief about abortion...what are you going to do about it?”**

Russ went on to tell me that he wanted to stand for the lives of the unborn, but he didn't know what to do. I shared with him how JFA's mission is “to train thousands to make abortion unthinkable for millions, one person at a time.”

Russ understood that, in order to make a difference “one person at a time,” one must have conversations. I walked him through the JFA Exhibit Brochure and explained to him how to use it to have those life-changing conversations. I then

encouraged him to use his voice to stand for the defenseless. I think he came away feeling much more equipped to make that stand for the unborn than before our conversation.

The challenge I gave Russ is one that I'm taking seriously in my own life. **I'm dedicated to doing something about the injustice of abortion, and working with JFA is helping me to achieve this goal.**

Since I've started working with JFA, I've grown a lot. I've grown in my knowledge of how to

defend the unborn child. I've grown in my ability to communicate my beliefs clearly and concisely while striving to speak in love. I've grown in my trust in God and in His plan for me.

I used to say I trusted God and how He had designed me, but deep down I doubted greatly. I didn't understand how He was going to use me. I felt like the abilities He had given me didn't really fit together.

I work in the office doing data entry among other tasks. I communicate one-on-one with those who go through a JFA seminar and those I meet on outreach. I write newsletters (More will be coming in the future!) I'm forced to think deeply about what I believe and to try to understand what others believe. Additionally, I challenge those I meet at a JFA seminar or outreach, as well as those in my everyday life, to stand for Truth. There are plenty of opportunities in the office and during outreaches to make people smile. And all of this helps save the lives of little ones inside the womb!!!

This is just a small glimpse of how I fit into the ministry of JFA. **I honestly could write pages and pages on how I've seen God's perfect plan unfold. He's made it very clear this is where He wants me.**

I'm excited about this upcoming summer! I will be taking part in a five-week program with JFA that will train me in how to speak and train others through our seminars. I'm also still working in the JFA office part-time while I raise support for my two-year internship.


Results of My Support Raising Efforts to Date
