Dear Family and Friends,

Due to many of my friends getting married in the last few years, I've had the joy of attending numerous baby showers. At one of these baby showers, we played a game called “Things You Never Thought You Would Say.” Everyone was asked to write things that they had said to children that were odd or had surprised them. The game brought many laughs and stories. My favorite story that was shared was about a mother who had exclaimed to her child, “Get your feet out of the cheese!” Even as an aunt, I've definitely had moments when I've thought, “Whoa, I never thought I would have to tell someone not to do that!”

In a much less humorous way, I've had similar experiences at outreach events with Justice For All (JFA), too. At Fort Hays State University (FHSU), I met Kenneth and Justin. They believed that abortion should be legal early in pregnancy, and they also advocated for killing thousands of born human beings because they believed that the world is overpopulated. The idea of having the right to kill people stemmed from their belief that there is no absolute truth. As I was talking with them, I asked some clarification questions that helped them to understand the consequences of their views. Justin then proclaimed, “Wow, we sound like monsters!”

I replied by saying, “I don't think you are monsters, but I do think your view is pretty crazy. **What I don't think is crazy, however, is for me to say that we should look for ways other than killing people to solve our issues. I think it is absolutely reasonable to value human life.**”

The simplest truths are sometimes the most powerful. Kenneth and Justin looked up at me almost in awe, like what I had said was the most profound truth in the world.

What strikes me about conversations like this one is that they show clearly that the fight for truth is real. It seems like it should be common sense that killing innocent human beings is wrong. But in my conversations on college campuses, I find quite often that many people believe that this is acceptable, at least intellectually. My goal is to prick the moral conscience of each one of these people. Often times when they actually understand the consequences of their beliefs, they tell me that I have given them a lot to think about and they leave thinking about what we have discussed. I do not think that it takes a super hero to say things that prick someone's heart. In my conversation at FHSU, it was a very simple statement that became a big moment in our conversation.

Too often, people who know the truth are not challenging these increasingly-acceptable, crazy ideas. I wish I could say that the conversation I had with Kenneth and Justin was rare, but it's not. I am becoming convinced, more and more, of how necessary it is for people to stand up and speak out on the truth about abortion, the Gospel, and other moral issues. People need others to lovingly guide them to believe more true things, and we should be the ones guiding them.

Thank you for supporting me as I (by the grace of God) aim to defend the truth in 2015. I pray that we would all be faithful in defending what is right.
