Dear Family and Friends,

Recently Justice For All trained volunteers how to have truthful, yet loving, conversations about abortion here in my hometown of Wichita, Kansas. We held an outreach event at Wichita State University (WSU) as a part of that training. It was great to have my sister and some of my good friends come out to campus to join us. Here's a glimpse into some of my conversations.



I talked to Jared on Monday morning, and wow, was it an adventure! He started by saying that he believed abortion should be available up until the unborn is able to survive outside the womb. I gently challenged him by asking if it's possible that our value is based on what we are instead of what we can do. We exchanged ideas on abortion, human value, and God. Then, in an interesting turn of events, Jared informed me that he is already pro-life and just wanted to see what I would say! Even though it was unexpected, my hope is that I helped Jared see he has good reason to hold his pro-life views.



Jenelle is pro-life, but had many questions when I met her. I was able to come alongside her to help her realize more fully the dignity and humanity of the unborn child. I shared the Justice For All Exhibit Brochure with her, which includes images of the unborn before and after abortion. I also showed her the pregnancy resource phone numbers in the back of the brochure in case she or someone she knows ever needs help with an unplanned pregnancy. I'm thankful for the opportunity to equip pro-life people like Jenelle. If more people become a voice for the voiceless, abortion rates would likely drop more quickly.



Sosa started the conversation by asking me if I was religious. After telling him he would have to talk to me to find out, he quickly said, "Look, I'm not religious. I've talked to you guys before [he was referring to JFA's last WSU event] and I don't agree that unborn human beings have the same value as you and I." Because we had a foundational disagreement about human value, I jumped to discussing the Source of human value by asking, "Okay. So, what do you think about God?" I listened to Sosa and then was able to share the Gospel of Jesus with him. I told him that I would be praying for him to have a reason to seek God.
