### The Decision

Every week as I stood outside of an Austin abortion clinic, I saw child after child being led to his death, and that experience influenced me profoundly. I also saw the impact that a single conversation can have as I witnessed women who came to their abortion appointments choose to keep their babies after having short discussions with the sidewalk counselors present. I had started visiting the abortion clinic looking for a meaningful way to spend one morning a week. Instead, it changed my whole life.

There is so much bad news about abortion that I decided I must start being a part of the good news. I want to train people how to talk about abortion. I want to see the hearts of those who currently consider themselves pro-choice changed, and I want to see lives saved because people realize unborn children are valuable human beings.

Our family has decided to begin the adventure of a lifetime. We are leaving our home, our church, my career, and our beloved Austin so that we can join Justice For All (JFA).

### One of My JFA Campus Experiences

I saw the life-changing value of what Justice For All does first-hand when I was on campus with them at the University of Texas at San Antonio. In one conversation I talked to a pro-choice woman who had had an abortion and seemed to have no regrets.

During our conversation I showed her a picture of a seven-week-old human in the womb. She stood in stunned silence. Then, she began muttering over and over again, "That can't be. That can't be."

She told me that she had aborted her child at seven weeks of age and that she could not believe her child was so clearly human. This moment of realization may very well save the life of her next child, and that realization would not have come to her were it not for Justice For All being on her campus that day.
