This Year at a Glance

One of my office tasks is to record and report JFA's yearly numbers. Here is a snapshot of 2013.

563 volunteers were trained (by taking part in both Seat Work and Feet Work portions of our program). **515** additional people took part only in Seat Work. There were 43 Abortion: From Debate to Dialogue seminars and 42 dialogue outreach events. Additionally, our staff gave 47 presentations with a total of 1,964 attendees.
