
Support Report

Stepping Up and Stepping Out

Jeff Reinke is a supporter, family friend, and member of the Western Hills Church of Christ in Lawton, Oklahoma. Like many, Jeff learned of our work because he heard me speak at church. When challenged to do more than acquire head knowledge, Jeff took that step by joining us for training this fall. Here are some of his thoughts on his experience:



“The UNT event was tremendous for me personally. Although I may never know if I impacted anyone’s long term mindset about abortion, I know that just talking to students in a rational way made them think more about what it means to be human.”

“The real impact that I saw was the one-on-one dialogues that develop around the exhibit—that is where real progress can be made to change minds about the unborn.”

“I look forward to opportunities to make impacts like this locally in my town and my little world . . . one mind at a time. . . . The training was helpful in giving me confidence in approaching others about this issue. To Justice For All, thanks for making an impact.”

Lacy Skrapka is a high school student who trained with us at Community Christian School in Norman, OK. She was quiet and reserved. After training, her friends brought her over so she could tell me her story. Her birth mother was still in school when she got pregnant. One of her teachers counseled her to consider adoption and told her about a couple who were struggling to have a child. The young girl agreed. Soon after she was born, Lacy left the hospital with her new family.

Lacy came to the campus of OU ready to listen to me and others do all the talking. So, naturally, I gave her a clipboard and asked her to survey some students to start dialogue. I flagged down the first few, then she and her partner Gatlyn were off and running. By the end of the day, she had had more than a dozen conversations and gotten to share her personal story at least once. I am so proud of her and other young students like her who step out in faith to give an answer for the hope that is within them. Lacy shared with me that just before Thanksgiving she told a friend at school, “You know what I’m thankful for? That I got a chance to live this life.”

Maybe you, too, will choose to join the work. You may not be able to do a two-day outreach, but are you willing to join us for training and learn how to do a two-minute outreach? Be watching for your opportunities in 2011.

You will likely not hear from me until February. We will travel to be with the other JFA families and board members on a working retreat in January. Then, towards the end of January, I will come full circle by working again at the Universities in Arizona, where it all began for me as a volunteer four years ago.
