


Speaking of The Duke, in 1969 John Wayne starred in *True Grit*, one of his most famous films, and the role for which he won an Oscar for Best Actor, but the real hero is a fourteen-year-old girl who sets out on a arduous journey for justice.

The movie is rated "G" for General Audiences. In the opening scene of the film, we see gambling, drunkenness, and murder. In the second scene, we see an entire county gather in the town square to watch three guilty prisoners hanged by the neck until dead. Children are skipping and playing, and some are being pushed in swings as everyone

watches the executions. There was a time in this country when we did not hide justice or injustice.

As we were setting up our dialogue tools on a campus this spring, two educators approached our team. They inquired if there was a way we could move or turn the large exhibit. They were afraid that



their high school students who were visiting the campus might see the graphic images of abortion and get upset. Really? We used to let children witness public hangings, but our modern high school students cannot handle pictures of a surgical procedure? We used to execute civil justice in the public square, but a modern teenage girl cannot handle viewing the results of what are supposedly her civil rights? We once openly displayed the death of the guilty, but now we hide the death of the innocent.

I did not mention to the educators that we were surrounded by high school students helping us erect the exhibit. I was afraid the irony might overcome their delicate dispositions.

If we forever shelter kids from looking at death, then how can they ever fully appreciate and respect life? Like the young girl from the John Wayne film who witnessed death and evil, but faced them head-on and bravely set out to set things right, the righteous young people who train with JFA can handle the truth, and they display True Grit.
