

In the bustle of people walking by I suddenly noticed Morgan standing a few feet away. I asked what he thought about the Justice For All (JFA) Exhibit at Oklahoma State University. For each justification he gave for aborting **unborn** children, I asked him to apply the same reasoning to killing **born** children. He ended up concluding that because the unborn are indeed as human as born people, his position was inconsistent.

When I saw that Morgan had written on an Exhibit response card that he was leaving the Exhibit “feeling completely different [about abortion],” I asked him to explain.

He shared that he had just come from the library where he had sat for two hours getting progressively fed up with seeing the Exhibit. So he came out to write a few choice expletives on the JFA free-speech board to tell us to “get off his campus.” But our conversation had instead diffused his anger.

He thanked me especially for being willing to talk about topics other than abortion.

When I mentioned that I would be at the Exhibit the next day as well, and **he suggested** that

we get together for lunch! We did, and I spent all afternoon talking with Morgan, telling him about my faith in God, and how my relationship with Christ affects everything I believe and do. He related that he used to be Christian, but that he had become more skeptical since attending college.

“This was most meaningful conversation I’ve had in years,”

Something changed as we talked, and by the time he left he said that it was the most meaningful conversation he’d had in years, and that he was convinced that he needed to seek out truth.

I prayed for Morgan that day, and continue to pray that God will send other people into his life.

Many of you know that I have volunteered during the past nine years with Justice For All (JFA), a pro-life ministry, whose mission is to train thousands to make abortion unthinkable for millions, one person at a time. After much prayer and thought, I have decided to work full-time with JFA starting in 2010.

For those of you less familiar with Justice For All’s training program, “*Abortion: From Debate to Dialogue*,” it has three primary parts:

What convinced me that Justice For All is where I should be fulltime was not only my own experience with students like Morgan, but watching, hearing so many others we've trained

over the years have the very same opportunity. We don't just impact people for good--we teach them to also impact others for good.

Additionally, we have seen many women who were abortion minded prior to viewing the JFA Exhibit decide to not abort children like Nicholas. His mom didn't even know she was pregnant with him when she saw the Justice For All Exhibit at North Texas. She later wrote to thank us and sent us a picture of Nick (right) who is now the joy of her life.

My role with Justice For All will primarily be to assist with the absolute best pro-life training in America and to help manage the logistics for our training events.

I plan to stay in College Station to build my financial support until summer, then move to Wichita, KS where JFA's office is located.

My position with JFA is not an internship, or a short term or part-time job. It is where I feel God calling me to invest my time for the foreseeable future. I will be sad to be so far away from my family and many friends, but I know that God shall provide for all of my needs.
