Jen brought six Biola students with her to the Arizona Exhibit during their semester break in January 2007.

He felt that there were so many groups of people that were oppressed in the world and thus was surprised that we were limiting ourselves to the abortion issue. He went on to explain that if we were not loving to all human beings then people would not listen to our "anti-abortion" message. Our conversation motivated me to be eager to defend the value of all human beings. I was able to show Jordan that I can disagree with his position on abortion but still love him.



Dialogue Tip: Empathize with concerns that are addressed, even if they don't hold moral weight in the discussion.

We can best minister to students like Jordan (story on previous page) by first listening to their concerns--even when their concerns do not have moral weight in the debate. We want to take the abortion issue from debate to dialogue, not beat people up. Part of dialogue is understanding the concerns people have that shape their emotions and their opinion on the issue. Jordan was concerned for poverty in America, abused women, and gay rights. **Jordan was much more attentive to our discussion of abortion when he realized that I cared about him and his concerns (even if I didn't agree with all of them) and that I was concerned for the rights of all human beings.**
