Would you turn down the offer of a steady job? Would you move across the country, leaving those you love behind? Would you learn to challenge those who defend the genocide?

I am willing to do all of these things to end the genocide of abortion which is taking place in all of our communities. **Will you help me stop the genocide?**

I found my passion for defending the unborn while attending Mercer University. When I graduated in May, I remained firmly steadfast in my decision to enter pro-life ministry full-time. “Here I am, Lord,” I said. “Wherever you send me, I will go. Whatever you command me, I will do.” Not long after, a friend introduced me to Justice for All (JFA).

I was well known at Mercer for my pro-life stance and passion. As such, many people thought I would be enemies with my pro-choice colleagues. However, the officers of the pro-choice club are some of my friends. Abortion was something we could discuss openly because of three key things: we respected each other, we listened to each other, and we acknowledged good points made by the other side.

I attended a JFA seminar in Kansas this summer and was amazed. Most apologetics training seminars are heavily lecture based. JFA, on the other hand, uses a more hands-on approach that challenges attendees to practice what they have learned and makes the training equally accessible to the inexperienced and seasoned alike.

The structure of the seminar also mirrors how abortion conversations tend to flow, something I can personally attest to. Throughout the seminar, JFA stresses that listening, asking questions, and affirming common ground, (all with a respectful attitude) build the foundation for conversations. These same qualities have been a part of the many conversations I’ve had with my pro-choice friends. I had an absolute blast at the seminar!

JFA’s training doesn’t end at the seminar; rather, the seminar is only the beginning. Coupled with the seminar is a campus outreach, where JFA participants put their training into immediate practice by talking to college students.

Better still, participants are given mentors who actively work to help students improve their ability to dialogue about abortion.

I will make several trips to JFA headquarters in Wichita, Kansas, this fall to receive more advanced training. The first of such trips will be later this month when I will attend a three-day training workshop, then immediately put my skills to use by helping JFA train Benedictine College students and mentor them during an outreach to the University of Kansas.

**To make these trips possible, I am raising \$1,500 to cover housing, food, and travel expenses.**
