



Progress In Georgia Despite The Weather

When I moved to Atlanta last year, I set out to build up the pro-life community on college campuses and expand Justice For All’s connections in Georgia. At that time the Kennesaw State University (KSU) pro-life club no longer existed. The club had become inactive after the previous members graduated, which is actually a very common occurrence. Within my first few months of living in Atlanta, I met pro-life students and ministry leaders at KSU and worked with them to create and solidify a club that could impact the campus with or without JFA.



Bobby Hinsdale, the leader of Ratio Christi, a Christian apologetics club at KSU, made things so much easier for the development of the pro-life club. His group invited Justice For All to Kennesaw State’s campus a few different times and some of his students were interested in restarting the pro-life club. In March, Ratio Christi hosted JFA for our seminar and outreach. Although the weather was extremely cold, many students were quite warm to talking with our staff and newly-trained volunteers about abortion—sharing their views and hearing our concerns about the injustice of abortion.



As if the cold wasn’t bad enough, our third day of outreach was cancelled due to a snow storm. The entire KSU campus was closed and all classes were cancelled due to the snow! That was a big frustration for me, especially given the momentum we had built with the KSU club. Also, we had hoped to bring out the 14 trained high school students from Fellowship Christian High School on the third day.



Thankfully, our partnership with Ratio Christi at KSU has proven very fruitful. The Ratio Christi club at Georgia State University heard about our local work and invited us to their campus in April. We were able to bring the Fellowship Christian students to join us there! Due to the help of all these partnerships and new friends, significant progress has been made in building up the pro-life community at Kennesaw State and engaging students who disagree. This fall we hope to return to KSU with the help of the newly formed pro-life club! Thanks for your support.
