It was at the Denver International Airport that I met Angie while waiting to board my next plane to Los Angeles. We talked and got to know a little about one another and what each of us does for a living.

After she found out that I was on my way to California to do pro-life mission work she informed me that she had a 16-year-old cousin that was in the midst of an unplanned pregnancy. Her cousin was unsure of what to do and was even considering abortion.

I had the perfect opportunity to give Angie information (our brochure) that she could pass on to her cousin. I also provided her with the phone number of a crisis pregnancy center.

Finally, we exchanged contact information so that we would be able to further provide her with whatever support she needed in order that she may minister to her cousin.

While I was on campus at PCC, I talked with Krista who is pro-life, but whose sister is pregnant and considering an abortion. I was able to walk her through our educational brochure and equip her with this tool so she could use it to attempt to change her sister's mind for life.

I made sure that she was aware of the information in the back of our brochure regarding ministries that provide support for women who have unplanned pregnancies. I also left her with the contact information of Justice For All so that we could keep in touch in case she needed any additional assistance.
