Dear Family and Friends,

Six years ago I began my active involvement in ending abortion in our country. The avenues which I found to make this change were collecting items for crisis pregnancy centers, joining and helping Students for Life at ASU in keeping an active presence on campus, volunteering with AZRTL and praying outside abortion clinics.

Through these commitments I came upon Justice for All (JFA). JFA is an organization that trains individuals (most often high school and college students) how to share the truth about abortion in a loving, compassionate and convincing way. They then bring a large exhibit to campus that displays the graphic truth of abortion and gives the newly trained individuals the opportunity to practice what they've learned.

My first experience with them showed me that real hearts and minds could be changed and lives were saved! I couldn't stop with that one experience and I volunteered whenever I could for the next two years. I have since joined them at six other campuses and helped with their groundbreaking training programs (truly unlike any other I have seen.) The truth is not enough people are working full time in this kind of work and the tragedy is 3500 babies are losing their lives to abortion daily in the US alone. I have recently made the decision to join the JFA team full-time as an intern.

In order to do this I need the assistance of fellow advocates for life. JFA staff and interns raise their salary through a team of financial and prayerful supporters. JFA monthly donors typically pledge a gift from \$5 to \$500 each month to the staff person they are supporting. The amount can be whatever you feel by faith you could provide. My need is to raise monthly commitments totaling in \$2500 by September 2008. After this is raised I will move to Wichita, Kansas and formally begin a two-year internship with JFA.
