A Different Kind of Spring Break

So why did four Wheaton College students and three volunteers from Florida choose Atlanta, Georgia as their destination? Why did they choose to drive a great distance, sleep little, and risk ridicule? They desired to help us reach people with the truth.

Holly Meath (see below), Voice For Life (VFL) club leader at Wheaton College, led three club members on a trip that would change each of their lives, and help transform many others' lives. Sam, James, Collette, and Holly

drove from Chicago, to Atlanta. They arrived the night before our seminar in Woodstock, Georgia that was held to prepare volunteers for our Georgia Tech outreach event. Jon Wagner, facilitator for the seminar, said this about them: "I witnessed their growth firsthand as loving pro-life students and leaders."

Three other volunteers, Emmy, Aislyn, and Virginia, traveled to Atlanta from Florida instead of hitting a trendy Spring Break location, or staying near the beach in the Sunshine State. They joined us for that same Woodstock seminar and prepared themselves to dive into three days of discussion, frustration, joy, hope, and changed hearts at Georgia Tech.

All seven of these volunteers were proactive in applying the lessons learned in the seminar during our campus outreach. They impacted one person at a time through gracious discussions on the topics of abortion, human value, and faith.

Jon Wagner, JFA staff member, met Holly Meath when he visited Wheaton college a few years back to help with a Voice For Life (VFL) event that his sister Joanna organized. Last fall, JFA offered Holly a 1-year internship, and she accepted. She will begin her internship after her graduation this Spring.

She recently wrote in her letter to prospective donors:

Ever since I was a child just beginning to grasp the terrible facts about abortion, I felt that God was placing this issue strongly on my heart. That sense of calling hasn't gone away—it's grown through high school and especially throughout college, where my opportunities to serve have blossomed through the Wheaton College pro-life club."
