Dear Friend,

It's been an eventful semester for me. I spoke during eleven in-person training events and participated in thirteen days of outreach on eight university campuses with the Justice For All team. We had many productive conversations over these last few months, and some people changed their minds on abortion! In addition, on eighteen different days this fall, I was sidewalk counseling at San Diego county abortion clinics.

As I listen to Christmas music this season, my favorite song has these beautiful words: "Long lay the world in sin and error pining; Till He appeared and the soul felt its worth; A thrill of hope, the weary world rejoices."

Our world is still weary and heavy with so much suffering. Many people see abortion as a quick-fix solution to difficult situations. Jesus had a different way. He responded to weakness, struggle, and pain with gentleness and love. His response was to heal people, encourage them, and remind them how much their life mattered. We can model that for others by how we respond to people's pain. So much good can come out of so much suffering. Sometimes we just need to wait in the dark for a time. We can be messengers of hope, helping people see that the darkness is temporary.

Of all the ways God could have entered our world, He chose to come as a vulnerable baby in the womb. He chose to be completely dependent on His mother's body. The weak and vulnerable are often despised and forgotten in our world, but great things often come from them. A baby in a womb 2000 years ago would be responsible for the salvation of the world.
