"The JFA Exhibit is something you can't ignore."

Monday morning, I walked to class and saw the warning signs - 'Graphic Photos Ahead.' I put my backpack in class and ventured timidly out to [Dexter] lawn. Before I could get down the steps a student sitting on the stairs said, 'I don't think you will want to go much further.'

I didn't even initiate my first conversation! I simply responded, 'Actually, I've already seen the display... what do you think about it?'

That simple introduction launched us in to a 20 minute conversation not only about abortion, but he shared his religious background and expressed interest in mine.

I found it so much easier to listen and actually hear what he and everyone was saying because I had been prepared thanks to the training the day before!!

Justice For All takes the mask off. It stands bare and unashamed. JFA sees the truth through all the muck and mire, willing to share that with everyone.

JFA has given me such encouragement to stand unashamed to defend what I believe."
