Dear Friend,

It is very common during an election season to hear people talk about what the law should be for abortion. It's also very common to hear some version of the following sentiment in those discussions:

"I'm pro-life, but I can't tell other people what to do. Therefore, abortion should be legal."

JFA trainer Rebecca Haschke did a beautiful job of helping one young man think through this sentiment. She describes their conversation in her letter entitled "#Mindblown" (enclosed). In his case, because he had religious reasons for his point of view on abortion, he felt that he was disqualified from making a case that abortion should not be legal.

I think you'll be encouraged to see how this young man came to see things differently in just minutes. In the process, you'll witness Rebecca's manner, and you'll learn a sequence of questions you can ask when you are confronted with this sort of concern in conversations with friends and neighbors.
