Dear family and friends,

Tony George was minding his own business as a pre-dental student when JFA rolled onto his Colorado campus.

As he put it, “...nothing could prepare me for the 18-foot high JFA Exhibit. The sight of it compelled me to share with my fellow students on JFA’s open microphone about the tragedy of 4,000 children being aborted every day in our country.

After JFA left... I lost a lot of sleep, sickened by what I believe to be the biggest injustice in our country. I couldn’t stop thinking about how horrible it was that children were being killed in my own country, in my own town for that matter! I agonized over it constantly and felt that I just wasn’t doing enough about the problem. My heart was restless.”

Tony decided to join our 2009 May Mission trip to California, where he went through both the “Abortion: From Debate to Dialogue” seminar and

advanced training camp, including pro-life outreach on the beach. He continues:

“The training I received... was an excellent preparation for the actual event. (It) provided me with confidence and gave great tips for initiating dialogue

and helping people realize that abortion is indeed a terrible crisis worldwide.

I had the opportunity to talk to many people and defend my position. I remember talking to one girl who was going into law school. She was very sharp. She told me she was pro-choice and couldn’t understand how a seemingly reasonable person like myself could think that abortion should be illegal.

After explaining why I felt the way I did and answering some of her questions, she said *Wow, you just took me from not understanding pro-lifers to almost completely agreeing with them...*

I am very excited to continue working with Justice For All. When I went on the trip with JFA I had never participated in anything more fulfilling. I finally realized that this is where I need to be right now and decided to do a one semester internship with the organization.

**For the first time in my college life my heart is at rest and my mind is at ease, knowing that I can be a voice for those who cannot speak for themselves.”**

Tony’s passion and his gentle-but-bold way of conversing about abortion allowed him to make a big impact during the outreach to KU. He’s now learning to teach a portion of the ADD seminar, which he’ll do at this week’s outreach.
