



Two Lives Saved in Texas!

The JFA team and I recently returned from the University of Texas-San Antonio (UTSA) where we trained 65 volunteers to be defenders of the unborn. We also challenged thousands of students on the campus to think more clearly about abortion. Your support has made this and trainings like it all across the country possible. Thank you!

We have received confirmation of at least two lives saved through this outreach.

I personally was blessed with the opportunity to help challenge someone about abortion and to plant seeds that will hopefully lead one young man to salvation. March 29th was our first day on campus at UTSA. The display panels were being set up and I was standing around waiting for further directions from our team leader when a young man walked up to me. He asked me what we were setting up for.

I told him about our mission to have constructive dialogue about abortion on his campus and then asked him if he was pro-life or pro-choice. He told me that he was pro-choice so I asked him to explain his position. Our discussion continued on for the next hour and ultimately we came to the agreement that the most important question when considering abortion was "What are the unborn?". By the time he had to leave, the exhibit and adjacent poll table had been set up and the question of the day was, "Should abortion remain legal"? As he was walking away to class, he signed the "No" answer. **I was thrilled to help him understand that abortion is an injustice.**

I pray that he continues questioning and finds for himself the reason human beings are valuable. In my book, just one mind changing about abortion made the entire trip worth it.
